



The Washington State Health Care Authority (HCA) has launched a program to raise awareness about the importance of locking up medications. With every prescription, our goal is to increase the number of people who safely store their medications at home.

## **Program Background**

Our challenge is to get more people to lock up their medications while they have them at home to reduce the risk of misuse. Here's what you need to know:

- HCA is hosting the program in partnership with
- · This location is an established prescription drug take back site
- The program builds on the relationship between pharmacists and their customers, asking them to make a pledge to lock up their prescriptions

## **How the Program Works**

This program combines three actions to support more people locking up medication:

- The pharmacist asking the customer to lock up their medication
- · Giving the customer a free locking bag or bottle if they need one
- Asking customers to fill out a pledge card (first name only) that goes on the pharmacy wall to demonstrate safe storage as a community norm

## **Program Success**

To evaluate the success of this program, we will follow up with customers who participated. A brief survey will ask:

- 1. If the customer received a locking bag
- 2. If the customer locked up their medication
- 3. If the customer used a take back site to dispose of unused medication
- 4. How the customer views safe storage
