## DRUG TAKE BACK DAY

Last year, Washington residents  
returned 13,571 lbs of medication  
on National Take Back Days. Over  
345,000 lbs of medication have  
been safely disposed of at Take  
Back Day sites since 2016, reducing  
access to expired, unused, or  
unwanted medication.<sup>1</sup>



Opioid pain medications prescribed by doctors include oxycodone, hydrocodone, codeine, morphine and many others.<sup>2</sup>

In Washington, every day can be drug take-back day. Community kiosk drop-off sites across the state are a safe, convenient and secure way to dispose of any leftover medications.
