Dispose of unwanted, unused or expired opioid prescriptions safely at a:

- Community kiosk drop-off site (often pharmacies and law enforcement stations)
- National Drug Take Back Day Event (April and October)

## FIND A SITE NEAR YOU

It has never been easier to safely dispose of unused or expired medications in Washington. This year, even more locations have become community kiosk drop-off sites. These sites allow you to bring expired or unwanted medicines to convenient locations for proper disposal. To find a location near you, visit MED-Project.org and enter your zip code.

OR drop off your old or unused prescriptions at a permanent kiosk:



75 percent of opioid misuse starts with people using medication that wasn't prescribed for them, usually taken from a friend or family member.<sup>1</sup>



Opioid pain medications prescribed by doctors include oxycodone, hydrocodone, codeine, morphine and many others.<sup>2</sup>



Community kiosk drop-off sites across the state are a safe, convenient and secure way to dispose of any leftover medications.



Mail-Back services for expired or unwanted medicines are available, free of charge, to all Washington residents upon request. Visit MED-Project.org to request free mail back envelopes.
