It has never been easier to safely
dispose of unused or expired
medications in Washington. This
year, even more locations have
become community kiosk drop-off
sites. These sites allow you to bring
expired or unwanted medicines
to convenient locations for proper

**OR drop off your old or unused
prescriptions at a permanent kiosk:**



75 percent of opioid misuse starts with people using medication that wasn't prescribed for them, usually taken from a friend or family member.¹



Opioid pain medications prescribed by doctors include oxycodone, hydrocodone, codeine, morphine and many others.²



Community kiosk drop-off sites across the state are a safe, convenient and secure way to dispose of any leftover medications.
