



The Washington State Health Care Authority (HCA) Pharmacy Safe Storage Program raises awareness about the importance of locking up prescription opioids. With every prescription, our goal is to increase the number of people who safely store their medications at home.

Program Background

Our challenge is to get more people to lock up their medications while they have them at home to reduce the risk of misuse. Here's what you need to know:

- HCA is hosting the program in partnership with pharmacies across Washington
- The program builds on the relationship between pharmacists and their customers, asking them to make a pledge to lock up their prescriptions

How the Program Works

This program combines three actions to support more people locking up medication:

- The pharmacist asking the customer to lock up their prescription opioids
- Giving the customer a free locking device if they need one
- Asking customers to fill out a pledge card (first name only) that goes on the pharmacy wall to demonstrate safe storage as a community norm

Program Materials

Participating pharmacies will receive:

- A training guide reviewing program background, materials and conversation steps
- Program poster and window clings to promote the program
- Pledge forms to display on the pharmacy wall
- A conversation tracker to track number of conversations with patients
- A card for patients to opt-in to a brief survey
- A handout to educate patients about naloxone

How You Can Help

- Let your patients know about the Safe Storage Program at your pharmacy
- Encourage your patients to always lock up prescription medications
