Here's what to know about naloxone:

Naloxone is safe.

- Naloxone has no side effects, and isn't habit-forming.

Naloxone is simple.

- You don't need any special training to use it, but you can't use it on yourself. Be sure to show someone where you keep it.

Naloxone is standard.

- Receiving a naloxone prescription with an opioid prescription is recommended practice. Your insurance may cover the cost. If not, there are free ways to get it.

Naloxone works.

- You may never need it, but you can rest assured that it's there just in case.
