## Washington chooses safe disposal.

Washingtonians returned 9,057 lbs. of medication during last year's National Take Back Days. Since 2016, over 349,000 lbs. have been safely disposed of – protecting people and the environment.<sup>1</sup>

Common prescription opioids include:

- Oxycodone (OxyContin)
- Hydrocodone (Vicodin, Norco)
- Tramadol
- Codeine
- Morphine



Nearly half of people misusing pain relievers, including prescription opioids, get them from a friend or family member.
